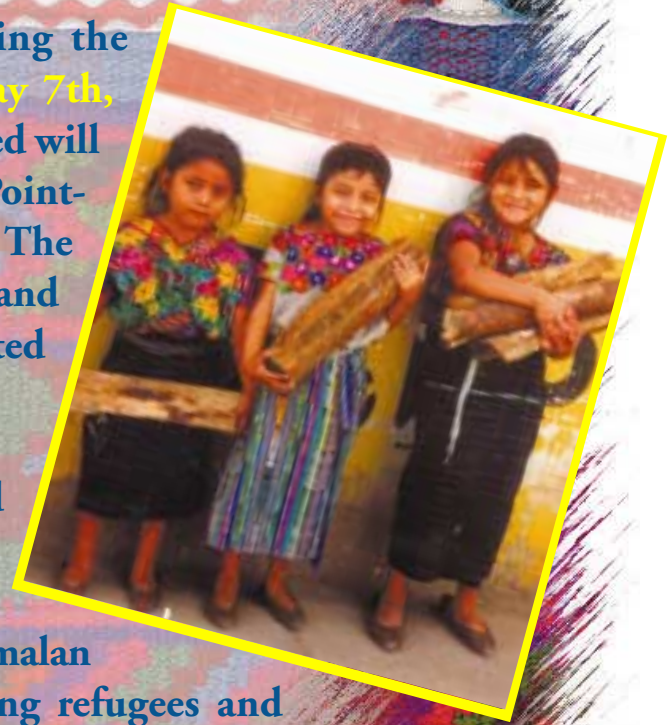


REQUEST FOR AID: THE GUATEMALA HEALTH CARE PROJECT

The **Guatemala Health Care Project** is a group of advanced practice nursing students and faculty from UCSF who will be returning to Guatemala for the second year to provide health care to underserved areas, in collaboration with Guatemalan organizations. Communities served will include returning refugees and Hurricane Mitch victims.

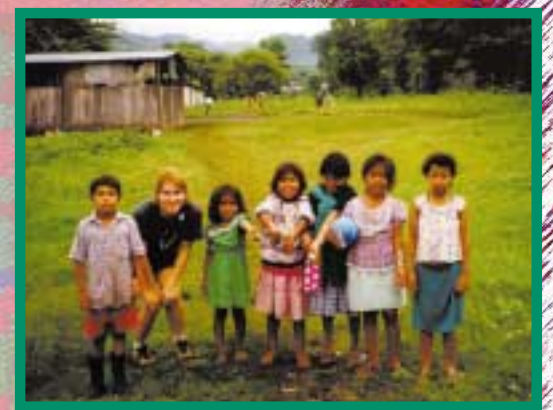
100% of the donations will go to direct patient care. Students and faculty will finance their own expenses. Donations are needed to purchase supplies and medicine at cost. Specific supplies include but are not limited to the following:



Medicines: Analgesics (acetaminophen, aspirin, ibuprofen), antibiotic ointments (Bactroban, bacitracin), anti-fungal creams, lice and scabies treatments, multivitamins, iron supplements, antacids, and hydrocortisone cream.

Supplies: Bandages, Band-aides, gauze, gloves, surgical tape, and sterile sutures.

Hygiene Products: Soap (for sensitive skin, waterless), toothbrushes, and toothpaste.



Donations are welcome and very much appreciated. A little goes a long way, for example:

\$10 will treat 6 children for ear infections

\$20 will treat systemically, 10 children for skin infections

\$40 will treat 900 patients for parasites
